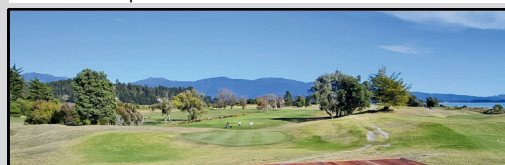


Recent updates from around our region

Expect the track to be hot under the Marlborough Summer Sun so bring plenty of refreshments for the day.
